A) Will you go to college?

B) Will you go into the military?
IF SO: Which branch?
IF SO: Will you make a career out of the military?
C) Will you go directly to work instead?
IF SO: What will you be doing for a job or jobs?
Consider using this paragraph transition as your first sentence in paragraph 3 – After I
graduate from high school, (or similar)
Fourth Paragraph:
(Think about you as a 40 year old for this paragraph.)
Name the date that you will turn 40 years old.
Where do you think you will be living?
What will your job or jobs be?
